



Terrorism Cases:

- *R v Khan, Zaman and Others* [2008] - Possession of computer materials for a terrorist purpose (airline bombing). Case involving a very large amount of computer generated material obtained over the internet. "Operation Overt" - Re-trial 2009
- *R v Saleem (Central Criminal Court)* [2008] - 7th July bombing case
- *R v Arafat Waheed Khan* [2008] - Airline bombing
- *R v Sulieman (Blackfriars Crown Court)* [2008] – Serious articles for terrorism case involving very extensive computer evidence. Serious case where the other 2 adult defendants received sentences in double figures
- *R v Kabashi (Central Criminal Court)* [2008] - 21st July bombing case
- *R v Sohail Qureshi (Central Criminal Court)* [2008] - Preparing for acts of terrorism – the "Lyrical Terrorist case"
- *R v Siraj Ali [Kingston Crown Court]* [2008] - 21st July bombing case
- *R v Haji.* [2008] Allegations of directing membership and funding Al Qaeda
- *R v Wasim Mughal (Woolwich Crown Court)* [2007/08] - Al-Quaida website terrorist case
- *R v Barot & Others (Woolwich CC)* [2007] - "Gas Limos Project"/radioactive "Dirty Bomb" terrorist trial
- *R v Tsouli and others (AG Ref No. 85, 86 and 87)* [2007] - Client who was accused of inciting murder over the internet by running the media wing of al-Qaeda in Iraq. In this case the volume of computer generated material was so extensive that it was cited in Parliament by the Government as the justification for the failed attempt to extend the period of pre-charge detention to 90 days

- *R v Bouchra El-Hor (Central Criminal Court) [2007]* - Defendant acquitted of charge of failing to disclose information relating to alleged plot to commit terrorist offences. Wife actively encouraged her husband to become a terrorist and had offered herself and the couple's five-month-old son for martyrdom
- *R v Al Bashir Mohammed Al Faqih [2007]* - Charged with two counts under s. 58(1)(b) of the Terrorism Act 2000 of possessing documents containing information of a kind likely to be useful to a person committing or preparing an act of terrorism. The Defendant's case was the first case on the definition of terrorism, an issue that goes to the heart of all terrorism legislation
- *R v Junade Feroze [2007]* - Dirty Bomb
- *R v Ismail Kamoka [2007]* - Funding a Libyan terrorist group
- *R v Abu Hamza [2006/7]* - Inciting terrorism
- *R v Jawad Akbar [2006/7]* - Fertilizer bomb case. "Operation Crevace" Appeal in 2008
- *R v Zahid Hussain Sharif [2005]* - Tel Aviv suicide bombings
- *R v Noel Maguire [2003]* - IRA plotting a bombing campaign in mainland Britain. The first was on the BBC Television centre in March, then in Ealing Broadway, west London, in August and finally in Smallbrook, Queensway, Birmingham
- *R v Pa Jobe*. Another case concerning possession of computing materials for a terrorist purpose. An interlocutory appeal in this case by the Prosecution as to the ingredients of offences under s.57 and 58 will be heard in House of Lords in October 2008
- *R v Avery & Others*. Members of the team acted for 2 of the defendants in the biggest animal rights prosecution to date prosecuting the organisers of 'SHAC' for a 12 year blackmail conspiracy against Huntingdon Life Sciences, one of the largest animal testing facilities in the world
- *R v Rajib Khan (Kingston Crown Court)* - Al-Mujahiroun terrorist incitement to murder
